A Good Place to Call Home

Summer finally arrived with our wonderful 4th of July parade and a stretch of good weather. We thank the many musicians, marching bands, organizations, First Responders, our neighbors from the Shinnecock Nation and others who participated. The Commission of Patriotic Events team (CVO) is to be commended for organizing this large undertaking year after year.

We have all read the recent news headlines about water contamination on the South Fork, particularly with private wells. Fortunately, Southampton Village is hooked up to public water, that is frequently tested and filtered for an array of contaminants. Still, our water is retrieved from the aquifer below us and we must all take care. Nitrogen discharge is the single most harmful culprit to our water quality and comes from outdated septic systems. We recently adopted a new law requiring an I/A septic system, that acts like a mini-sewage treatment system, for any new home construction or the addition of a bedroom in residences that are located in sensitive areas as identified by the Town of Southampton. Last month,

a new I/A septic system was installed at the public restroom at Lake Agawam. (This will reduce nitrogen discharge by over 70%, a vast improvement!) We are the first municipality to install an I/A system for public use – thank you Mayor Irving for leading this effort, along with our Department of Public Works. Also, the Town of Southampton recently increased incentives for residential homeowners who switch to the new I/A system, so hopefully you can take advantage of this program, particularly if your home is located close to any bodies of water.

As you know, our Village population swells from 5,000 to 20,000+ during the summer and increases traffic immeasurably which becomes a concern for our First Responders who must deal with emergencies quickly. Remember it is a New York State Law to yield to the right

of way when an emergency vehicle with lights or active sirens is approaching within 500 feet. Please pull as far to the right near the curb as possible. This applies to traffic moving in the same direction or in the opposite direction.

Speaking of First Responders, we are very proud to announce several promotions and new hires in our Police Department.

Letter from the Mayor


