

A Message From the Tax Receiver

Village taxes are due between June 1 and July 1 without penalty. If paying your taxes by online bill payment, please make sure that your address or tax map number is clearly displayed on the memo portion of your check. The preferred method is to include the stub with payment. Please note that the bill numbers change each year. This will ensure that payment of taxes is applied to the correct property. Please do not staple, tape or clip payments to the envelope or stub. Be sure to include your contact phone number and email address. Also note that payment of taxes sent by mail can only be recorded as received effective by the date postmarked from a U.S. Post office.

It is suggested that a taxpayer paying by mail near a deadline date send payment by registered mail or certified mail return receipt requested or have the envelope hand stamped at the local post office window. RPTL 925 (1) (a) states: If the post mark does not appear on such wrapper or the postmark is illegible, such payment shall be deemed to have been made on the date of delivery to such collecting officer. Duplicate copies of your tax bill and paid receipt can be obtained on the Village's website at www.southamptonvillage.org, under Departments, under Tax Receiver. Click on the Tax and Assessment Web Portal, no user name or password is required.

Happy Spring Everyone

Spring is officially here and we're already feeling the excitement of longer days, spring flowers and summer plans. Obviously we all have our own reasons for choosing to live here, but for me it includes our beautiful beaches, historic character, community spirit and open vistas.

Speaking of open vistas, we are very excited to have just preserved three acres on Pond Lane, situated directly across from Agawam Park through the Community Preservation Fund (CPF). Agawam Park has provided residents and visitors alike, with welcoming park festivities, along with a playground, and benches to observe the pond and the wildlife. The preservation of these lots will support not only our fleeting open space and beautiful vista, but protect Lake Agawam's water quality, and the existing canopy of old growth trees. I thank our Mayor for his leadership, along with Joe McLoughlin from our Planning Commission, John Halsey at the Peconic Land Trust and the Southampton Town Board for their support in pursuing the protection of this valuable land. Protecting open space and farmland has been a primary goal outlined in our 1970 and 2000 Southampton Village Comprehensive Master Plans, so glad we finally got this priority parcel as there's not much open space left!

You may have seen a lot of road work recently in and around our business district. Our Department of Public Works (DPW) has been busy installing a dozen catch and leaching basins on Meeting House Lane and Jobs Lane. These basins catch heavy water run-off before it flows into Lake Agawam and will further

protect water quality, as much of the run-off contains contaminants. Thank you DPW!

On another good note, we just received the highest credit rating from Standard & Poor's. So with our finances in good order, this is a good time to revisit our 2000 Comprehensive Master Plan – which lays out the long-term objectives for our Village. What should we be doing to benefit the community? We have received a variety of good suggestions from many of you, including the need for a senior center, an indoor pool, more walkable/biking areas, a waste treatment system, placing utility wires underground, emergency management plans for climate change, and creating a carbon free village to name a few. More to come on relaunching the Comprehensive Master Plan later this year.

With the summer comes heavy traffic, a reminder that the LIRR South Fork Commuter Connection has begun and offers two morning, peak time trains east-bound from Speonk to Montauk and two west-bound trains late in the afternoon. In addition, there will be bus/shuttle connections to bring people to employment centers.

And last, Police Officer Moore and his four-footed partner, Topper, just earned the Certification for Patrol Work after six hard months. They already share a strong bond with each other and many residents who they have met. As Trustee Hattrick noted, we are all happy to see 'Topper the Copper' patrolling and protecting the Village. The SHPD thanks the community for their past donations in funding our new K9 Program.

Beach Parking Permits Required May 15 - Sept 15



Village Beach Parking Permits for the 2019 Season are available now at Village Hall. Avoid waiting in line and apply by mail (see form on reverse side.) Please note the fee for the "Local" Non-Village Residents Parking Permits is \$250 or for Local Non-Village Resident Seniors or Veterans a discounted rate of \$175,* (Seniors = 65 years old by September 2, 2019; Veterans = current military ID or DD 214, **limited to one vehicle per household**) and for Summer visitors is \$450 (**Senior/Vet discount not available**).

All Village Parking Permits are available at Village Hall Monday - Friday or by mail. Local Non-Village Resident and Summer Visitor Parking Permits are also available at Cooper's Beach beginning May 25th, weekends only and daily after June 22nd. Day Passes are available at Cooper's Beach, \$50 each, and are valid **ONLY** at Cooper's Beach.

All Village Beaches, except Cooper's Beach, will require a permit from May 15th until September 15th. Permits required at Cooper's Beach beginning May 25th of Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day, September 2nd. Road D does not require any permit at all. Remember Dune Beach is for Village **RESIDENTS** only - Resident permit required.

Lifeguards on duty at Cooper's Beach **ONLY**, weekends beginning Memorial Day weekend and daily after June 22nd through Labor Day.

Spring Cleanup Program

Your cooperation will help us to provide better service to you. Please take note of the following:

After **April 30th, streets will have one final pickup and will then be checked off as completed.**

Once completed, crews will not return for any reason.

Only leaves placed in biodegradable leaf bags will be picked up. The biodegradable leaf bags are the only acceptable bags to use and are available, five for \$2, at Village Hall.

The cleanup will be for fallen winterkill branches and leaves only. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS!

No pruning or brush from trees, shrubs or other material from clearing of property will be allowed.

The Highway Department does NOT pick up any of the following:

- Plastic bags
- Construction debris
- Hedge clippings or hedge trimming brush of any kind
- Grass clippings
- Potted plants
- Stumps of any kind
- Iron fence posts or any type of stakes
- Rocks or dirt
- Bricks or blocks
- Cans, bottles or garbage of any kind
- Wood or brush except winterkill

Disposal of these items is the responsibility of the individual property owner. In the past, many of these items have been mixed in with leaves or brush. This can cause serious injury to our workers and expensive damage to our machinery.

Letter from the Mayor

Welcome to Spring and the start of another season in the Village! Over the past few months, myself and Trustee McGann have been meeting with members of the Village Business District in an effort to curb the growing concern over vacant retail space. At present there are about eighteen vacant shops, which does exceed the recommended 10% and is at one of the highest levels since a peak in 2008. While this issue is nation-wide, we need to address it. We have had four meetings to date with a great sharing of ideas from shop owners, managers, restaurateurs, real estate and sales personnel.

Southampton Village has always been known for its fabulous boutiques, art galleries and wonderful restaurants. The walkability of the Village's architecture continues to be an important contributing element to shopping in the Village. It is this experience that gives the Village an edge. The consumer expectations of shopping have changed from "bricks to clicks"; we need to bring back the Bricks.

2019 continues to be a year of change in retail. It is agreed that the rent structures in the Village are high and we will begin to see them become more reasonable. We are quick to forget that many of the shops have been in the Village for years - Hildreth's (celebrating their 176th year!), Herrick Hardware, Home Nature, Flying Point Surf Shop, Edward Archer, Golden Pear, Sip & Soda, Jildor Shoes, Dazzelle, Xanadu, J. McLaughlin's, Chico's, Renaissance, Therapy, Ralph Lauren, Tenet, Corwin Jewelers, Rotations, Gubbins, Stevenson's Toys, Herbert & Rist, Silvers, Sant Ambroeus, Catena's, Le Chef, Shippy's, Schmidt's, Sean's Place, Southampton Publick House, Topiary Flower & Candy Shoppes and La Parmigiana to name a few. These shops have survived because they have adapted to the evolving retail landscape by taking proactive steps to accommodate changes in consumer behavior.

As a result of these discussions, the Village is taking steps to promote the shopping

experience to bring back the "Brick" to Southampton Village. We are currently engaging a marketing specialist to help us create a "Visit Southampton Village" campaign

in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce. This will include a new website and social media platform to promote our business district and support businesses using Instagram, Facebook and email to reach their customer base. The Village promotes the arts with the Cultural Center, Arts Center and History Museum, all of who offer great programs including exhibitions, free Concerts in the Park, movies at Coopers Beach and the Arts Center; these coupled with events like SouthamptonFest all drive activity to our downtown.

We are also taking a look at parking in the business district, focusing on time limits and the possible use of meters. Long term; we are revisiting the septic issue. We have reached out to Robert Gibbs, who in 2013 did a study of the retail business district and he is sharing new material that he believes will be helpful.

With retail taking a proactive approach to the changing demands of the consumer by using their physical space for a greater experience, and the Village and Chamber providing support with social media, events and capital improvements promoting the walkability to the shopping experience, vacancies will become a problem of the past. There is no better comment expressed by the business owners than "by working together we can bring the 'Bricks' back to Southampton Village."

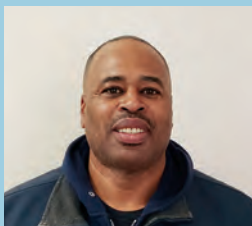

Southampton Village 2019 Beach Parking Permit Requirements

You may now receive your 2019 Beach Parking Permits by mail. We encourage all residents and non-residents to take advantage of this service. To process your Permit request we will require the following items:

Village Residents (available at Village Hall or by mail)

FOR PROPERTY OWNERS:

- Valid Vehicle Registration in the taxpayer's name ONLY for each vehicle requested
- Telephone number where you can be reached weekdays
- Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE)
(If NOT included, we will NOT mail your permit)

FOR YEAR ROUND RENTERS IN THE VILLAGE:

- Valid Vehicle Registration in the renter's name ONLY for each vehicle requested
- Year-Round Lease (Must be here for at least 1 year prior to May 2019)
- 3 utility bills – in your name and with the Village service address from Spring 2018, Winter 2018/2019 and Spring 2019
- Telephone number where you can be reached weekdays
- Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE)
(If NOT included, we will NOT mail your permit)

Day passes for Cooper's Beach are available only at Cooper's Beach for \$50 per day and valid ONLY at Cooper's Beach.

Non-Residents

FOR LOCAL NON-VILLAGE RESIDENTS:

(Residing within Southampton Fire or School District—available at Village Hall, Cooper's Beach or by mail.)

- Valid Vehicle Registration in the taxpayer's name ONLY for each vehicle requested
- Southampton Town Tax bill OR
 - Year-round lease and 3 utility bills
- Telephone number where you can be reached weekdays
- Check or money order payable to Village of Southampton in the amount of \$250 per vehicle
- NOTE: Proof required for Senior Citizens or Veterans:
Seniors who are 65 years or older by September 2, 2019 and Veterans with current military ID or DD214 qualify for a reduced rate of \$175. One discounted permit per household and available ONLY at Village Hall. (not Cooper's Beach)
- Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE)
(If NOT included, we will NOT mail your permit)

FOR SUMMER VISITORS:

(Permits are available at Village Hall, by mail or at Cooper's Beach)

- Valid Vehicle Registration for each vehicle requested
- Telephone number where you can be reached weekdays
- Check or money order payable to Village of Southampton in the amount of \$450 per vehicle
- Self-Addressed Stamped Envelope (SASE)
(If NOT included, we will NOT mail your permit)
- NOTE: There is NO Discount on the Summer Visitor Permit
